### Mark Scheme

Features of answers	Likely pupil comments
<b>Low</b>	
<p>Refers simply to what is present in the picture.</p> <p>Cannot offer any valid reason for difference.</p>	<p>She has a long stick in one picture, and her dress is different.</p>
<b>Middle</b>	
<p>Grasps that she is warlike in one picture, but not in the other. Offers simple idea that not everyone agreed what she was like.</p>	<p>They are different because history books always have different pictures of people in the past, because they're made up</p>
<b>High</b>	
<p>Clearly sees that in one picture she is warlike, the other peaceful. Also notes other discrepancies. Hints that lack of evidence explains the difference.</p>	<p>She is ready to fight in one picture. In the other one she is more peaceful. They are different because nobody knows what she was really like so all books draw different pictures.</p>
<b>Very high</b>	
<p>Without prompting, confidently suggests that one image might be drawn from Roman accounts</p>	<p>The one on the right makes her seem warlike. This is probably a Roman view because they didn't like her when she revolted. The other one is probably from Celts who were on her side. People often drew or painted people as they wanted others to see them.</p>
